THE ACTOR'S LAB

Join *The Actor's Lab* at WAAPA for 'Mondays in May' – it will have your acting muscles working overtime! This course is designed for those who want to continue to develop their acting skills and engage in activities designed to empower them to perform more truthfully. Drawing on 'post-Stanislavski' acting techniques, the Actor's Lab will enable students to learn how to be fully present in a scene.

ACTING FOUNDATION COURSE
