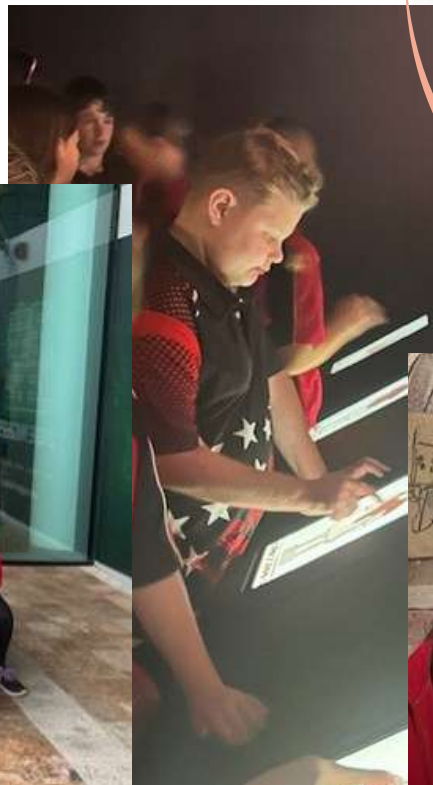

Year 6 Museum Visit

Our Year 6 class enjoyed a wonderful excursion to the WA Museum Boola Bardip to explore the fascinating Terracotta Warriors exhibition.

The Terracotta Warriors are considered one of the greatest archaeological discoveries of the 20th century. Created over 2,000 years ago to guard the tomb of China’s first emperor, Qin Shi Huang, each life-sized clay figure is unique, showcasing remarkable craftsmanship and detail.

The exhibition gave students an opportunity to engage with history and culture in an interactive way.

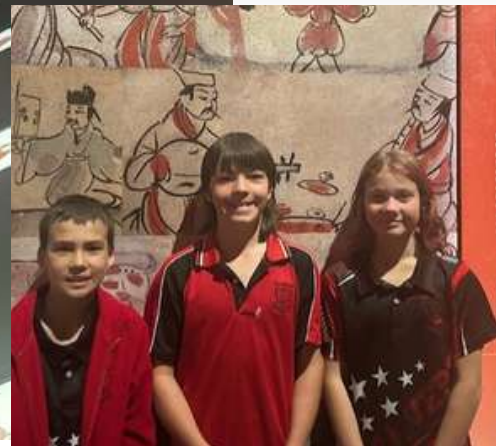
A huge thanks to our parent volunteers who went along with the group and to our Year 6 teachers, Mrs Shaw and Miss Simpson.
