### NAPLAN 2025

We've received preliminary school, class, and individual results for Reading, Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation, and Numeracy from last term's NAPLAN. Across Years 3, 5, 7, and 9, most students are achieving at strong or developing proficiency levels. Student Summary Reports will be shared later this year. We are currently reviewing results to strengthen our literacy and numeracy programs and intervention support.

### Senior Teacher Recognition

Experienced teachers all have the opportunity to apply to become a senior teacher. Here at Beverley DHS, 10 of our teachers currently hold Level 1 or 2 Senior Teacher status, recognising their extensive classroom expertise. These teachers contribute to curriculum delivery, student support, and school priorities, demonstrating the strength and quality of our staff. We are very fortunate to have such a high calibre of teaching staff at our school.

### Beverley Airshow 2026

## WA Student Assistance Payment

As a parent or carer of school-aged kids, you can claim the second round of the WA Student Assistance Payment.

This is money to help you get things for your kids. This can include:

- new school shoes
- backpacks
- sports gear
- uniforms
- food

All WA school students from Kindergarten to Year 12 can get it if they are enrolled at school.

You will need your child's 8-digit

WA Student Number to claim.

This number is located on the front of student semester reports but if you need assistance, please contact the school.
