School Board Election - 2021

Do you know a country student who needs support with the cost of attending secondary school? Students currently in Years 6-11 at our school may be eligible for a James and Rose Coombe Scholarship for 2021. Twenty or more scholarships are available each year and successful applicants can reapply in subsequent years. The funding amount starts at \$1 000. Funds can be used to support the student with any of the costs associated with attending a public secondary school located 65km or more from Perth. Applications for this scholarship close at 5.30pm on Thursday 10 December (Week 9). 2021 Leeuwin Ocean Adventure Voyage Sponsorship - CBH






Our students were offered the chance to experience the world of Virtual Reality with an incursion from Airborne IT.
