Below is the Beverley District High School Board's endorsed schedule of Contributions and Charges relevant to secondary students for 2020. The total amount of Contributions that parents/guardians are asked to pay has been contained to the \$235.00 as set by the Department of Education. CONTRIBUTIONS:

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure and help us to deliver a variety of learning programs for our secondary students.

Payment of Contributions may be made in full at the start of the year or alternatively a time payment schedule through Centrepay can be arranged with the Manager, Corporate Services. Holders of Pension, Health Care or Concession Cards are eligible for \$235.00 towards the Contribution. An invoice will be sent at the beginning of the year with EFT details.
