What You Will Learn

- **Teens** will learn about their right to feel safe, how their body lets them know when they may be in an unsafe situation and how they can identify a network of people who can help them.
- **Parents** will gain the knowledge and practical skills to empower children in regards to their personal safety. It will show parents how to upskill their child with strategies to help them stay safe. The focus of this 'life skills' program is to help prevent harm from coming to our children. Parents will be taught how to raise the issue of personal safety in such a way that doesn't leave the child feeling scared, anxious or worried. It is also done in a non threatening and non sexual way.

Liz Tropiano is a teacher and qualified childcare worker. She has 13 years experience working with children ranging from 6 weeks - 15yrs in group care and classroom settings.
