Principal's update:			

Hello all,

How is it already half way through Week 4? Time flies when kids are back at school and you're having fun! Our State Government announced more re-activation measures for schools last week, in that unless students have a medical exemption everyone should be back at school as of this week. I am very proud to say that our community responded in a fashion we've all come to expect, we have been well above 90% attendance all week. It has been great to have a full school again, well done everyone.

Whilst we are back to normal attendance it still isn't quiet business as usual. All learning programs are back up and running though a lot of the extra-curricular activities still have restrictions in place. For example, parent help, interschool carnivals and assemblies still aren't allowed to take place, yet. Further to that, we are still asking parents to drop their children at the school gates where safe to do so and to not come on to school property if at all possible. If you have to come onto school property, the only place that is permissible is through the front office. Once again, I know that these restrictions aren't ideal and are often inconvenient but they are in the best interest of our staff and student's safety and I thank you for your ongoing and unwavering support.

I am very happy to say that our Faction Cross Country Carnival will be going ahead this year, though as with a lot of things it may look at little different than most years. Mrs Bailey and I are still working out the details and I will let her communicate those to you when they are settled. What I can confirm is that there will be cross country races, there will be a winning faction and all of the hard work that students are putting into their training at the moment is worthwhile and very impressive! Keep it up everyone!

Reporting this semester will look different than the norm, again this is due to COVID. In Week 8 last term our attendance dropped from 90% to 20% over the course of 5 days. Week 9 and 10 we didn't have students on site at school and Weeks 1-3 this term was a mix of at school and 'at home learning'. As a result of this our State Government is working on temporary changes to reporting, for this Semester, to accommodate for those disruptions and inconsistencies. I will have more specific information regarding this in a fortnights time.

In the meantime, it seems that Winter has come a few weeks early, it is very cold in the mornings and this means rugging up before coming to school. Please ensure that you children have adequate warm clothing and that it complies with the school's uniform policy.

We are also seeing a lot of students coming to school earlier and earlier. Students are not to be on site before 8:20 in the morning as there is no supervision. If something unforeseen comes up and students do happen to be on site before 8:20 they are now required to sit in the canteen undercover area.

As mentioned in Week 2, this will be the last newsletter that is printed out and given to family representatives in class. The newsletter will be sent home via an email attachment to every family and will continue to be available via the library in Connect and on our school's website.
