## GASTROENTERITIS INFORMATION

Gastroenteritis (gastro) is a bowel infection that can cause nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, fever and stomach pain. It can be caused by many different germs, such as bacteria, viruses or parasites. It can be spread easily and is more common and severe in babies and young children.

The main treatment is to encourage drinking small amounts of fluids regularly, such as water, oral rehydration solution, or diluted apple juice, so that the child/adult doesn't become dehydrated.

It is important to seek medical advice if fluids cannot be kept down, if there is blood in the poo, severe stomach pain, if the infected child/adult shows signs of dehydration such as dry lips/mouth and less frequent going to the toilet to pass urine, or if the parent has any other concerns.

As gastro is infectious, thorough handwashing is very important after contact with a sick person or things they have touched. The child or adult should stay away from day care, school or work until at least 48 hours after all symptoms have stopped.
